

Section 1

Section 1 is at the western end of the cemetery. The rows are in alignment with the orientation of the buildings and are close to a north-south geographic (rather than magnetic) axis. To the west is a boundary wall and a line of trees. The southern end is bounded by a dry-stone wall.

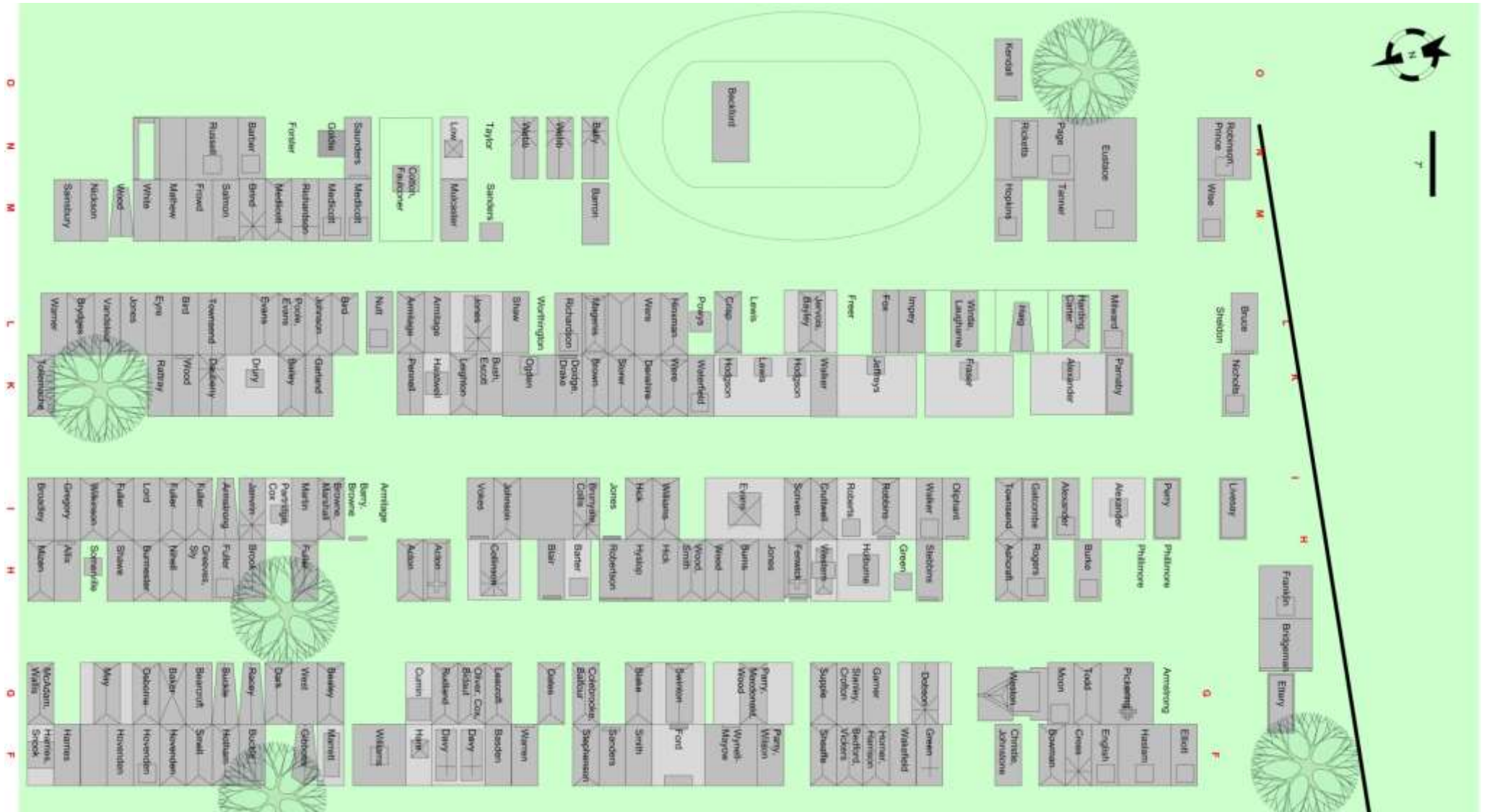

EVICTIONS TO BE MADE BY THE AID OF MILITARY AND POLICE LONDON, July 17. - Evictions on the Vandeleur estate in West Clare will begin tomorrow, and this will not tend to soothe the present feverish state of part feeling. One hundred and fourteen families, representing 1,000 people, are to be turned out of their homes for refusing to pay what they deem exorbitant rents. The evicting force consists of 500 dragoons and infantry, in addition to the constabulary, and the preparations are elaborate as they might be for a small war. All the houses are barricaded, but the police are provided with battering rams. Parish priests are actively at work counseling submission, and it is hoped that there be no blood shed. The arrears of rent amount to £80,000. This large sum, however, is mainly due to the arbitrary raising of rentals in 1874, which most of the tenants have never been able to pay. While assistant chief commissioner of the Dublin Metropolitan Police (he was commissioner 1883-1893), he was one of three people tasked with investigating the Phoenix Park murders in 1882. He was Under-Secretary for Ireland from 1893 to 1902. He was knighted in 1893. The appointment of his successor in 1902 caused some controversy.</p> <p>The death of Juliana Harrel, aged 91, was registered 1931 Bath. He was trained in seamanship at the Royal Naval School, Gosport, but for a time entered the merchant service, making several voyages to and from the Antipodes in the employment of one of the great shipping companies of those days. At the end of the Crimean War he was given, instead of a naval cadetship, a nomination to the Royal Irish Constabulary, then a new force.</p>

		<p>He served with it from 1859 to 1879, in which year he was appointed a Resident Magistrate for County Mayo. Four years later he was appointed Chief Commissioner of the Dublin Metropolitan Police, and it was during this term of office that the Invincibles were brought to justice for the murders of Lord Frederick Cavendish and Mr. Burke.</p> <p>He was Under-Secretary for Ireland from 1893 to 1902, when he resigned because of ill-health, which fortunately proved only temporary. ...</p> <p>Harrel was a thorough Irishman and a fine Irish gentleman. He understood the people, and they knew and appreciated him accordingly. He used to tell how when he left the resident magistracy which he had held during the wild days of the land war, enjoying the full esteem and affection of the people among whom he adjudicated, he was given a glorious send-off by the people of Ballaghaderreen, the Land League band playing him to the station. His understanding of the people, as well as his wisdom and broad tolerance, would have been invaluable in an Irish settlement. Perhaps it was his own modesty which prevented his occupying a higher position than that of Under-Secretary.</p> <p>...</p> <p>Honours came to him: he was sworn of the Irish Privy Council, and was created G.C.B., G.B.E., and K.C.V.O.</p> <p>He married in 1863 Juliana, daughter of the Rev. R. N. Horner, and had three sons and two daughters. One of his sons was formerly Assistant Commissioner of Dublin Metropolitan Police. 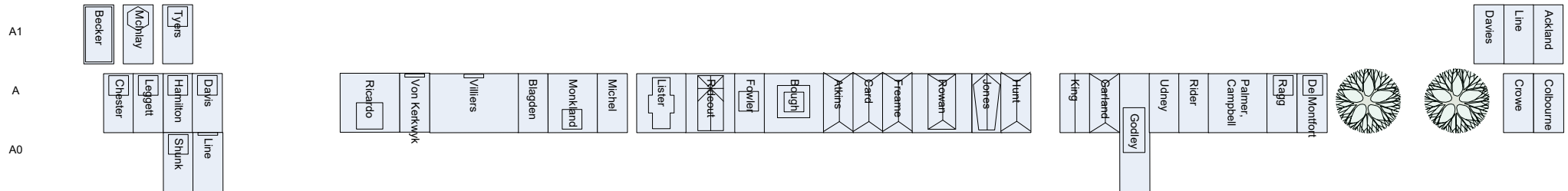

On reaching New Zealand, she eluded his vigilance, and took a passage back to Sydney under an assumed name. Thither he followed without delay, but again he was doomed to disappointment, as he learnt that she and the partner of her flight had set sail for England, taking with them the property he was so anxious to recover. We must not forget to mention one ruse practised by this abandoned woman in order to conceal the abstraction of plate and jewellery, left by her husband in his deed-box, at the Bank of South Australia, and to which, under the power-of-attorney, she had free access. 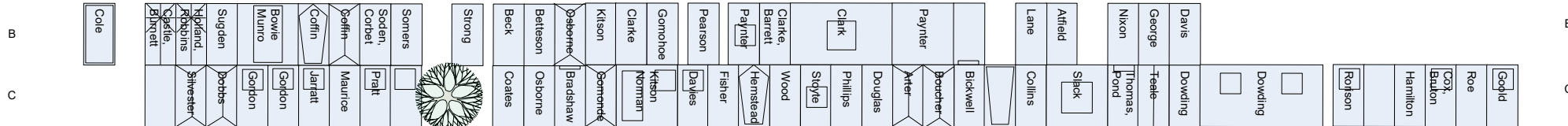

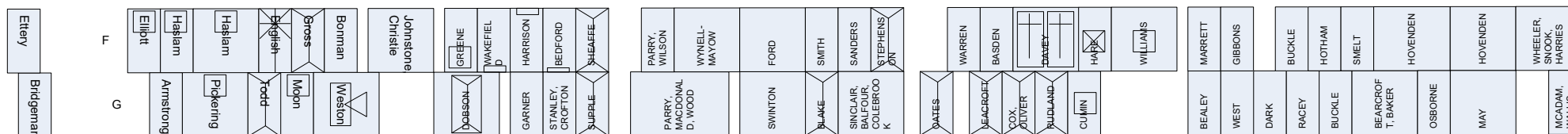

Captain Francis Holburne was expected to succeed as the 5th Baronet of Menstrie but died after being wounded at the Battle of Bayonne in 1814. His younger brother William prepared to inherit the title and estate which, six years later, came to him on the death of his father. He abandoned his naval career and embarked on a rather late Grand Tour during which, it seems, his avid collecting began. 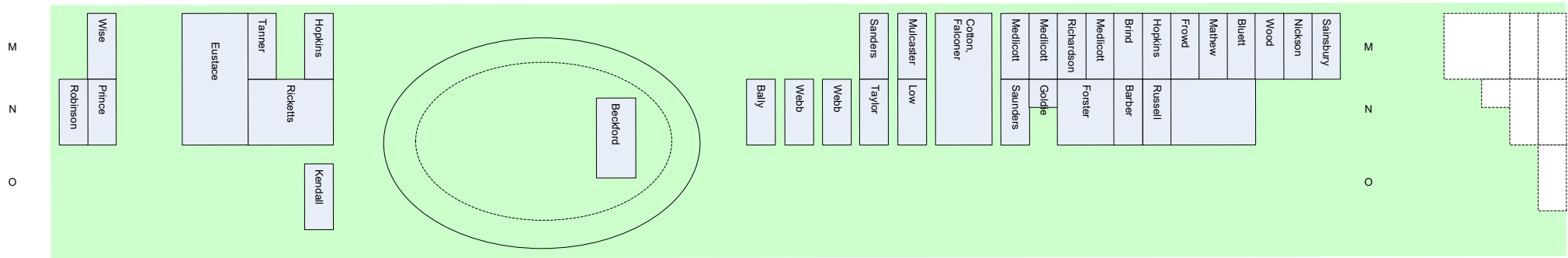

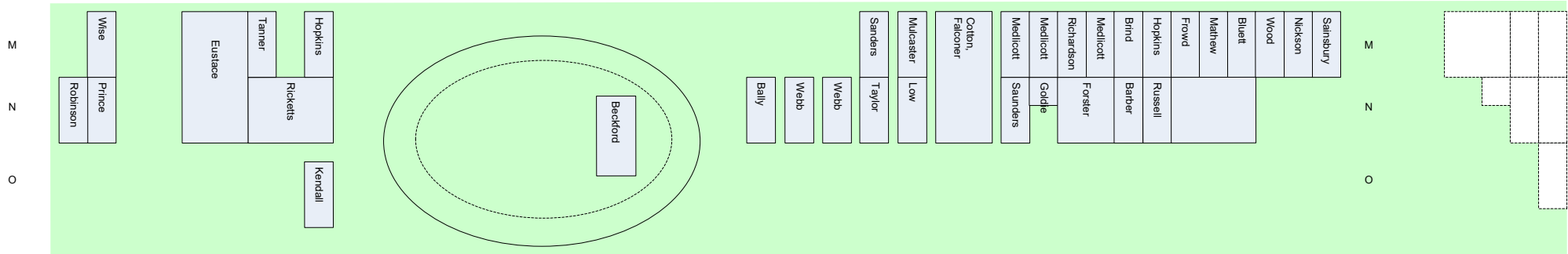
